

Weiti Boating Club Policy 03/10/11

Grid Activities as allowed by the Resource Management Act & Auckland Council Boat Maintenance Policy

Permitted activities on the grids are:

- The removal of algal film by means of low pressure water blasting (pressure less than 1400 PSI)
- The removal of algal film by means of sponging and hand scrubbing
- Changing zinc anodes
- Mechanical inspections and maintenance (such as changing a propeller)

Non-permitted activities on the grids are:

- High pressure water blasting above or below the waterline (pressure more than 1400 PSI)
- Scraping off antifouling paint
- Wet or dry sanding antifouling paint
- Abrading zinc anodes by any means, including water blasting and sanding
- Dripping or spilling antifouling paint onto the mud or into the water
- Causing the water or mud to change colour, froth, foam, scum or have an oil residue due to contamination of any type
- Leaving dislodged marine organisms on the seabed or in the water
- Leaving debris (including topside sanding dust) on the seabed or in the water

Weiti Boating Club Incorporated Policy:

- It is Weiti Boating Club's policy that all personnel undertaking boat maintenance and repairs must comply with the provisions of the Resource Management Act and Auckland Council's Draft Boat Maintenance Policy published by the ARC, 1995.
